## Be Daring like Pope Francis

Pope Francis is to set up a commission to study the possibility of female deacons in the Catholic Church - National Catholic Reporter wrote last Thursday. Yes, our Pope is open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. He is trying to love like Jesus. Therefore he discerns what to do and what not to do by asking 'what would Jesus do'. Our lives are not to be guided by what we used to do, but rather what Jesus wants. Our lives needs to reflect our bonding with Christ the way Jesus was bonded with God the Father.




Jesus told his disciples, if you love me you will keep my commandments. (14:15). The command of Jesus has two directives: be at the service of your neighbour and do the Eucharist as he showed at his last supper. The reward for keeping the commandments of Jesus Christ is the Holy Spirit. In other words, if we love Jesus Christ, God will make his home within us. Thus if we become God bearers, we will be working wonders in and around us. We read in the Acts of the Apostles about the wonders the apostles performed after receiving the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Not just then. Now we see wonders worked through people like Mother Teresa of Kolkata. Blessed Teresa dealing with people of different persuasions in Kolkata and surroundings, changed the 'heart of stone' into 'hearts of flesh'. In our own country Australia, a poor ordinary nun, St Mary Mackillop could educate the poor children of Australia and leave a legacy for many thousands to follow thereafter. The poor Irish Catholics in Australia, in their love for God, managed to establish schools and churches which has become everyone's envy. None of the people who have worked wonders in the name of the Lord did them because the circumstances were right, but because the Christians were bonded to God with love and fired up with the Holy Spirit

In an affluent situation like ours, we too need to work on strengthening our bonding with God. If we communicate with God in Eucharist and through our personal prayers, we too will have the strength and prudence to withstand social pressures to deviate from the teaching of Christ on various issues. We should not be timid in our reaction to national issues like asylum for refugees or redefining marriage and so on. We should also show enthusiasm in connecting with people of various cultures in our own parish. The inability to show fellowship with people who share same faith but are from another culture is another mark of our timidity. We need to transcend cultures in our love for God and faith life. We need to be daring like the Apostles in our witness to Christ. We need to be daring like Pope Francis in our witness to our faith.

## **Pastoral Planning**

Last Saturday, 7 May, about 35 people got together in the Jubilee Hall to discuss a pastoral plan for the parish. This is the third time some major stakeholders of the parish got together for an annual Pastoral Planning day. All adult members of the ministry groups and all members of the Planned Giving who have been supporting the parish through their offerings were invited to the planning meeting. The day started at 10 AM and after 6 hours of intensive discussions and deliberations it concluded at 4 PM, in time to get ready for the vigil Mass. The main theme of the workshops was ‘Vitality of the Parish – fellowship & stewardship’. Research findings of Dr Trudy Dantis identify 8 measures of vitality, based on the National Church Life Survey. They are as follows:

1. The vocational call of baptism is nurtured and parishioners are encouraged in their faith,
2. Liturgical celebrations offer an experience of God
3. Welcoming inclusion and hospitality abound and parishioners are encouraged to share their gifts
4. Spiritual fellowship and community bonds are nurtured and parishioners experience a strong sense of belonging
5. Parishioners are aware of and are formed in their commitment to mission and evangelisation
6. Practical and diverse service/outreach initiatives are practised
7. Collegial and collaborative leadership is practised
8. The parish is adaptable to changes and is involved in planning for the future

We were privileged to have Anthony Hill, Director, Evangelisation Project Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney to facilitate the workshops. It was also assisted by Phil Townsend Principal, SPC Primary School chairing the sessions and the school setting up a google docs network. The high tech approach helped to make better use of time. The participants identified six areas to focus on in the next 12 months. They are as follows:

- Introduce Welcomers to greet and meet before and after Mass. Introduce name tags once a month for all everyone in the church. Coordinator - Brenda Wendt-Hussein.
- Improve Liturgical music and singing. Coordinator - Maureen Haynes
- Adult Faith Formation and Education Coordinator - Trevor Brewty
- Using a skills inventory, prepare a talent/profession bank of parishioners Coordinator - Jenny Michael
- Year of mercy activities and reach out programs. Coordinator - Joy Skeritt
- Visitation of the Isolated, lonely, and nursing homes. Coordinator - Maria Simone.

It was also decided that this year the Parish Day should have processions and other celebrative aspects like the first one we had a couple of years ago. Karim Kassis is to coordinate the planning of the Day. Details of the Parish Day Celebrations will be discussed at the Pastoral Council on Thursday this week.

With all these initiatives, our parish community will grow in fellowship, sense of belonging, and enthusiasm.




## Lector Training


