



Pentecost Sunday—Year A

4 June 2017

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea

and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading

1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so

it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel

Jn 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven: for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Historical Context

Pentecost

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessing of the harvest and rather than the unleavened bread of Passover it was celebrated by leavening the bread. It was for this reason that the disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Spirit, promised by Jesus, that animated the disciples to spread the gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church.

The Spirit

We can sometimes regard Pentecost as the day the Holy Spirit came into the world. However, the Spirit had long been active in the world before this event. In fact, even the second verse of Genesis Chapter 1 tells us that the Spirit hovered over the waters. The Old Testament is filled with references in which 'The Spirit of God came upon (him) with power' and the Spirit was evident at Jesus' baptism and throughout the gospels. Jesus is frequently described as being 'filled with the Spirit'. So, from the very beginning of creation the Spirit has moved in the world and continues to energize it today.

Living the Gospel

Come, Holy Spirit

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, Vene Sancte Spiritus, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.

Powered Up by the Holy Spirit

Last Saturday twenty young people were anointed with Chrism and Confirmed by Bishop Tony. That marked the completion of Initiation of those young people into the Church. Now they are discerning how to participate in the mission and ministry of the Church. They are now empowered like the Apostles who received Holy Spirit at Pentecost to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ and his Church boldly.



Different people demonstrate their boldness in taking up the mission of Christ differently. Rani Maria, will be beatified in November this year, showed her mission spirit in a very powerful way. She was disturbed by the terrible and unchristian treatment of poor people by the landlords in North India. Therefore Rani Maria, empowered by the Holy Spirit, worked towards empowering the poor people to seek liberation from the landlords. This work of proclaiming the good news of Christ and his Church brought her much trouble. At the end, in 1995, a hitman, hired by the landlords, brutally knifed her to death. The perpetrators thought they could stop the work of the Holy Spirit by killing Rani Maria. They were wrong. A sister of Rani Maria, a nun herself, went to meet the murderer of Rani and told him that she forgives him. This was so powerful that it turned the heart of stone of this criminal into a heart of flesh. The parents of Rani Maria did something much more incredible. They invited the murderer of their daughter to their home and offered hospitality to show how forgiving they are. Where could they get the courage and will power to do it? They got it from the fullness of the Holy Spirit in them.

South Sudan is riddled with violence, poverty, lawlessness, and anarchy. Sister Dorothy (whom many of you know from our Church) knows it too well. She had been there a few times to help the poor helpless people. Still she went for replacing both her knees at once so that she can return to South Sudan soon. Where does she get the strength and courage to do so? The answer is the fullness of the Holy Spirit. She is well aware of the power of the Spirit in her.

Fr George, who used to supply for us in my absence, fights malaria almost every year in his mission. Knowing how hard it is for him to live in the North East India, his siblings, who are well of, asked him to retire in Kerala. But Fr George happily endures the malaria and continues his mission as a good pastor in a much needed part of North East India. He is bold enough to do this because he is well aware of the power of Holy Spirit in him. There are many parishioners who are engaged in great and bold ways of participating in the mission of the Church. That's the greatness of our Parish!

The Apostles lost all their fear when they received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost and boldly preached the good news of Jesus Christ. On this Pentecost Sunday we are reminded that we too are filled with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. In what way are you cooperating with the Holy Spirit? Are you bold enough to share the mission of Christ and his Church and proclaim the good news of Christ through what we say and do?

Dear Parents, Carers and Grandparents

It is no secret that as a Sydney Catholic School community we have been deeply concerned that our Catholic students could be seriously disadvantaged by the Federal Government's proposed school funding model changes outlined in the 2017/18 Federal Budget.

In particular, our ability to work as a system of Catholic schools that supports and assists each other is at serious risk.

As a system of schools, we take very seriously the financial stewardship of the resources we are provided to fund the diverse needs of our students irrespective of their family background where they live or their financial circumstances.

The funding distribution model we currently use allows funds to be allocated across all our 152 Catholic schools. It also provides for a reasonably consistent low-fee cost structure and opportunities for every parish school community. The new proposed government model will alter this, with the potential for great disparity of fees from one school to another.

I am confident that 'people power' can help to highlight the importance of this issue to the politicians in Canberra and help achieve a fairer and equitable outcome for our schools.

Feasts & Memorials of the Week



Monday— St Boniface

St Boniface was born in c.675 in Devonshire and was educated at a Benedictine monastery. Ordained a priest at the age of thirty, Boniface became a missionary to Germany and in 722 was consecrated Bishop of Hesse. A popular story of his evangelisation tells of his encounter with a pagan tribe that worshipped the Norse god Thor in the form of an oak tree. Boniface walked up to the ancient tree and cut it down with an axe, then stood on the trunk and said, "How stands your mighty god? My God is stronger than he." This led to widespread conversions and with the timber from the oak, he built a chapel dedicated to St Peter, Prince of the Apostles. He became an Archbishop in 732 and died in 754 after being attacked by a band of pagans while evangelising in Holland.



Tuesday—St Marcellin Champagnat

Joseph Benedict Marcellin Champagnat was born in Marlies, France in 1789. At the end of the French Revolution, he entered the seminary and was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Lyon.

A man of deep prayer, Marcellin was grounded in a loving community. His devotion to the love of God, Mary, and his Brothers inspired him to a universal mission. The Marist Brothers were known for their family spirit and simple Gospel way of being fully present to each other and all people.

In 1955 Marcellin Champagnat was declared Blessed by Pope Pius XII. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on April 18, 1999.
