From your Pastor

Invitation to the Banquet

I was delighted to receive a floral arrangement sent to me on my return from holidays. Someone anonymously did it on behalf of the parish I believe. Thank you to my friends who were thoughtful and I missed my parish, though the holidays were very enjoyable.

Kerala, where I spent most of my time visiting family, relations and friends, lately has a special spiritual development. There are plenty of retreat centres and spiritual renewal centres. They are in fact on the increase, because the demand is ever growing. What makes so many people want to attend a retreat a few times a year? Though the economy is booming in Kerala, more and more people are getting disillusioned. They realise that wealth and riches are not as reliable as the Word of God. At the end of life we cannot cling on to our prosperity. Only the banquet of the Lord can satisfy us without fail.

Jesus told a parable of a wedding feast which was not attended by the invited guests of the King. Therefore the King lets everyone else to come in for the feast to celebrate with him. This sounds like Jesus retelling the story of the feast told by prophet Isaiah which we heard in the first reading. The prophet announced that there will be an invitation by the Lord to a great feast. Jesus went one step further and said that the attendees will require a decision to do so. In reality many of the invited people had excuses for not attending the feast of the King. It is like someone prepared to undertake unethical business practice and defy the teachings of the Church. It is like someone prepared to abort a foetus for selfish reasons without any regard for the teachings of the Church. The lures and riches of the world can tempt us to find excuses for not accepting the invitation of Jesus to celebrate life with him.

Jesus adds one more twist to the story. At the end he says that the King expelled the person who was not wearing the wedding garment. It reminds me of many people who are keen to baptise their children into the Church and provide a Catholic Education for them. But when it comes to honouring Jesus Christ, who has invited us to his Communion Banquet, the lack of intent and preparation makes such people unworthy. If we count the nominal Catholics around us in Australia, the numbers are astounding and we can say the wedding hall is full. But when it comes to attendees with a wedding garment, that is the preparedness to honour the Lord, the numbers shrink. In such an atmosphere we need to be vigilant in our lives to keep ourselves always worthy of the communion with Jesus Christ. At the end that is the only thing that matters.



Feasts of the Week.

15 October - St Teresa of Jesus Born at Avila (Spain) in 1515. Died at Alba de Tormes in 1582. Left her aristocratic family for the Carmelite monastery in Avila at the age of twenty, but only after two decades of dryness in prayer felt an inner conversion to Christ. Honoured as a spiritual writer and mystic who experienced and comprehensively described the life of prayer. Remembered as a strong, practical reformer who restored the strict Carmelite observance of poverty, solitude, and austerity.



17 October - St Ignatius of Antioch Born probably in Syria. Died a martyr in Rome about 107. At Antioch, where he was bishop, his death has been commemorated on this day since the 4th century. Remembered for seven letters written on his way to execution. They show him to be devoted to Christ and his resurrection; they urge Christians to unity in and through the Eucharist and around their local bishop. Called himself the "God-bearer."



18 October - St Luke By early Christian tradition, Luke is named as author of the Third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. Almost certainly a Gentile and perhaps a companion of Saint Paul (29 June), he wrote to reassure those who had grown uncertain toward the end of the first century. In his gospel, the compassion of Christ is inclusive of all: Gentile and Jew, the poor and the rich, women and men, the outcast and the privileged.


