Jesus as Bread of Life



In the Gospel we see the crowd is searching enthusiastically for Jesus but when they find him he confronts them on their motivation, saying they must look beyond their full stomachs to see what God is saying to them through what has taken place. What God is asking of them is that they believe in the one he has sent.

In the gospel of John faith is not a concept, it is an activity. Believing in Jesus is the equivalent of doing the work that God wants because it involves a personal relationship, an abiding in him. However, the crowd don't understand and look for a sign such as their ancestors received. Jesus tells them he is the true bread, not like the manna, but the bread of God's word that satisfies the deepest human hunger. They are invited to nourish themselves on the bread of life, in other words to come to know and believe in Jesus. Here he is making use of the Old Testament symbolism of wisdom as nourishment to speak of Jesus as the only one who can satisfy our hunger for God. In Deuteronomy, we read 'Human beings do not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God'

We hunger for meaning, a sense of purpose and if that is addressed then we can be truly content. This is what Jesus, as the bread of life, is speaking about. In him we can come to understand ourselves and be amazed at our own dignity and worth in the sight of God. We are, at heart, spiritual beings and if we don't address that, then we might easily spend our time satisfying our appetites and daily needs and never our deepest inner needs, need for God and his kingdom.

To be a disciple of Jesus is to believe that many of our desires find their fulfilment in him and his teaching because he is the supreme gift of the Father to humanity. He is the Wisdom of God made fully accessible to us.

As food satisfies our human hunger, as water satisfies our human thirst, so Jesus satisfies our desire for wisdom and of access to life in its fullness. To assert that he is 'the true bread' is to assert that in him the needs that are greater than the immediate and the physical find fulfilment: he gives us true life, he gives us true joy, he gives us happiness that exceeds human happiness. All our joys, our hopes, our disappointments, our frustrations, and our fears, pains, suffering must have root in him alone.

He who believes in him will never thirst. So how do we express our faith in him? We express this faith in him as the Father's gift when we gather as his community, the community founded upon him, the community inspired by his wisdom, the community that shares his bread and his cup. Jesus says "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst," (v. 35).

Forget your vices and foolishness and return to God. Forgive the wrongdoings and sins of others, focus and offer everything to God. May he be our bread of life always.

Where do we stand? Are we eagerly waiting for Sundays to encounter him in the Eucharist? Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life. In the Eucharist we encounter him, in the word of god we encounter him, and in the community we encounter him. Let us renew our faith in him and move on and trust in him, and we pray for this intention during this mass .



Feasts of the Week.

4 August - St John Vianney Born near Lyons (France) in 1786. Died at Ars on this day in 1859. Overcame various obstacles, including little education and lack of means, to be ordained a priest. Served in a remote parish as the Curé of Ars, where his sanctity attracted thousands of visitors. Remembered for his preaching and confessional counsel and is honoured as a model for parish clergy.



6 August - The Transfiguration of the Lord: This feast had its origin in the East in the fourth century as the commemoration of the dedication of the church of the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. It was observed in the West from the eighth century and extended to the entire Western Church in the fifteenth century. The feast celebrates the divine radiance shining in Christ's human flesh and God's glory shining forth in the lives of Christians



8 August- St Mary of the Cross: Born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence. Named as the second patron of Australia on 15 January 2013.


